World Patient Safety Day - 17th September 2026

The 2026 edition of World Patient Safety Day focuses on addressing one of the major health concerns affecting billions of people and accounting for 74% of deaths worldwide, namely noncommunicable diseases (NCDs). Noncommunicable diseases are long-term conditions, such as cardiovascular diseases, cancers, diabetes and chronic respiratory diseases, that can affect people of all ages and often require ongoing care throughout life. Addressing NCDs is a global priority, reflected in the United Nations political declaration on NCDs and mental health, which calls for strengthened prevention and long-term management of NCDs. Achieving these commitments requires access to safe and quality care.

Globally, 1 in 10 patients is harmed during health care, with around half of this harm being...

World Suicide Prevention Day - 10th September 2026

Observed on September 10th each year, World Suicide Prevention Day aims to promote ways to prevent suicide. The International Association for Suicide Prevention (IASP) organizes the observance.

The numbers on suicide are grim. Each year, about 47,000 people die by suicide in the United States. That means, suicide is the 10th leading cause of death in the country. On average, 129 suicides occur in the United States per day. About 1.4 million people attempt suicide each year.

Suicide is a global phenomenon. Throughout the world, 800,000 people die each year by taking their own life. Among 15-29-year-olds, suicide is the leading cause of death. Multiple risk factors impact causes for suicide. The leading risk factors include mental illness, inability to cope with life stressors, and chronic pain and illness. Some of the most vulnerable groups for committing suicide include refugees, prisoners, and those in the LGBT community. Another vulnerable group - bullied kids.

What You Need to Know

Tips for Being Safe Patient



Healthcare-associated infections (HAIs) can spread from person to person, through hands, medical equipment and more. HAIs are becoming more resistant to antibiotics and antifungals, making them difficult, and sometimes impossible, to treat.

Patients and their loved ones can help prevent HAIs, including those caused by antimicrobial-resistant germs. These tips describe how to be a safe patient and help reduce your risk of infections

What you can do to be a safe patient;

1. Tell your healthcare provider about any recent care.
2. Tell your healthcare provider if you think you have an infection or if your infection is getting worse.
3. Take antibiotics exactly as prescribed and tell your healthcare provider if you have any side effects, such as diarrhea.
4. Remind staff and visitors to keep their hands clean.
5. Allow people to clean your room.

Myths and Facts

Educate Yourself and Share the Truth



A lot of myths surround suicide and depression. Often, people believe they are helpless to a person who is suicidal, or that talking about it may nudge the person in the wrong direction. These myths are not true. Educate yourself about these myths and share the truth with others. You may help save a life.

MYTH:

Those who talk about suicide don't do it.

FACT:

Most of the people who either attempted or completed suicide have made their intentions known ahead of time by either talking about it or by giving other clues. Talk of suicide should not be ignored or readily dismissed.

MYTH:

If you talk about suicide or ask someone if they are having thoughts about suicide, you will give people the idea to kill themselves.

FACT:

Chances are, if you are worried about someone and you have noticed the warning signs and risk factors, they've probably thought about suicide themselves. Asking somebody directly about suicidal thoughts often brings a sense of relief to the person in crisis and helps them to live, not give them ideas to die.

MYTH:

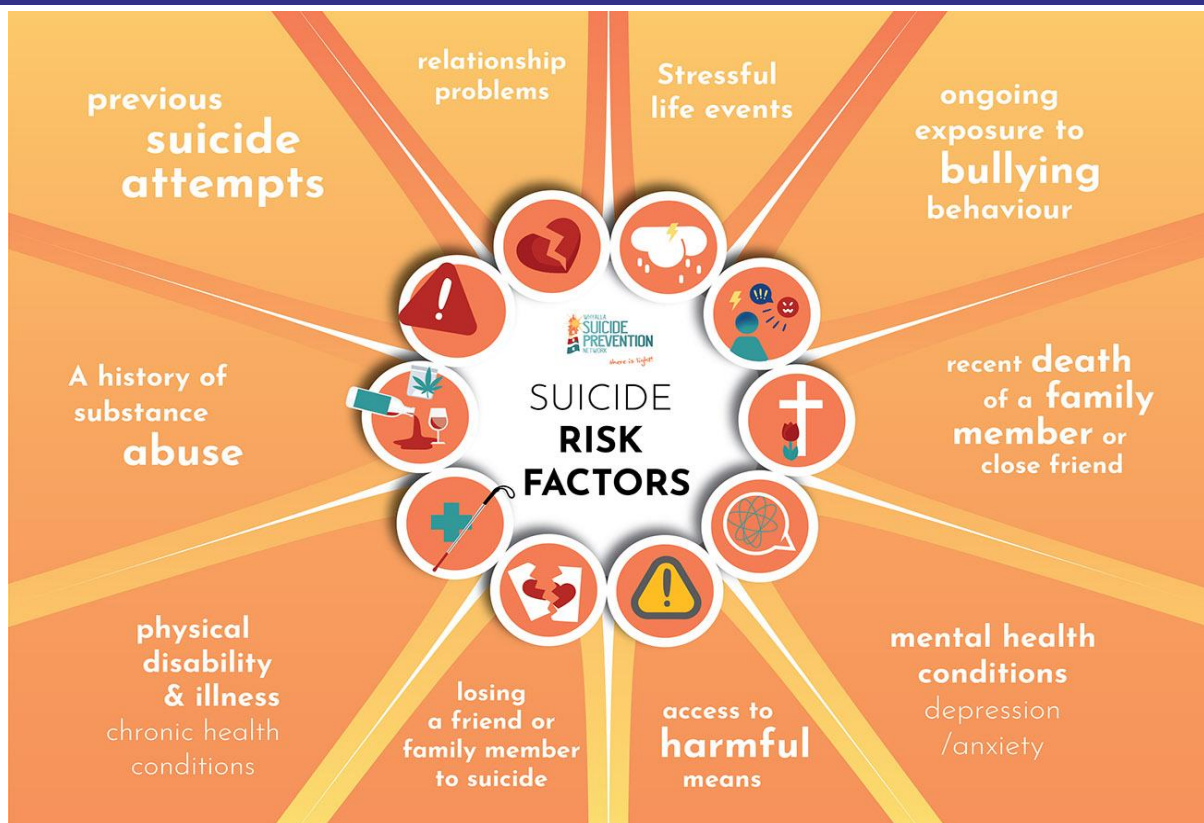
Only experts or professionals can prevent suicide.
